CMSgt Timothy “Blake” Henry is the Superintendent, 2d Weather Group, Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska. He ensures the delivery of specialized terrestrial, space, and climatological environmental intelligence to joint warfighters, Defense and State Department decision-makers, national agencies and allied nations for the planning and execution of missions across the spectrum of military operations. His team operates and sustains the Air Force Weather’s \$323M enterprise strategic computing complex and production network. He serves as the principal advisor to the Commander for 532 active duty, civil service, and contractor personnel at eight operating locations around the globe. He provides counseling and mentorship to personnel from 12 career fields on training, readiness, career progression, quality of life, morale, and discipline.

Chief Henry is a native of California who enlisted in the Air Force in January of 1999 and graduated from the Weather Apprentice course at Keesler Air Force Base the following August. His weather assignment experiences span both Air Force and Army locations in the United States and overseas. In addition, he has deployed five times on contingency operations as well as performed temporary duty supporting five NASA shuttle launch missions. Prior to assuming his current position, he served as Squadron Superintendent, 2d Weather Squadron, Offutt AFB, Nebraska.
