Colonel Brian D. Pukall is the Commander, 557th Weather Wing, Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska. He leads more than 1,450 active duty and civil service personnel at 18 locations around the world providing centralized weather products and services, including climatological and space weather support, to Air Force, Army, Joint Force, and other Department of Defense activities. The 557th Weather Wing executes worldwide weather operations to enable air and space superiority, intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance, rapid global mobility, global strike, and command and control in support of all geographic and functional combatant commands.

Colonel Pukall received his commission through the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps in 1991 after receiving a Mathematics degree from Concordia College. He is a Master Meteorologist, Foreign Affairs Officer and speaks both Italian and Spanish. He has commanded the 21st Operational Weather Squadron and the 31st Mission Support Group. Prior to his current position, Colonel Pukall was the Chief of the Security Assistance Branch, J-5, United States Southern Command, Miami, Florida, where he was responsible for ensuring support was provided to Department of Defense elements in Embassies across Southern Command's area of responsibility.
